hursday evening, Nov. 10th, 18 members and two prospective members met at Hickory Road BBQ, 5571 S. 48th Street. Aaron, the manager, said that Dan Emshoff (owner of Hickory Road BBQ) and his dad, Stan Emshoff, started in the food business by constructing a BBQ cooker and catering to groups and for celebrations. Dan opened Hickory Road and BBQ in downtown Auburn, Nebraska on June 1, 2007. The Lincoln location opened approximately two years ago. The menu had a wide variety of items; however, it looked like Ribs, Brisket, and Pulled Pork were the big winners. For side dishes, we had a choice of 11 items, including Grilled Green Beans, Creamed Corn, Brunswick Stew, and Memphis Fries. All of the BBQ is made daily and smoked slowly in a custom made smoker over a bed of hickory.

### January 21, 2017

n Saturday, Jan. 21st, 23 members of The Friendship Force of Lincoln met at noon at The Normandy at 2785 South 17th Street. Because there were so many of us, we were limited to ordering off the luncheon menu instead of the entire menu. However, the food selection wasn't limited; there was much to choose from, and all of it was superb. Before our orders were taken, the owner's right hand man spoke to us about the origin of the restaurant. It started as a tiny area in the Haymarket and grew to the restaurant they have now. The owner, who was at home with a sick child, is a member of a French aristocrat family. He broke all ties with the family in order to do what he had dreamed of with his own restaurant here in the United States. The present restaurant has been in its location for three to four years. French food is noted for its flavors, and we were all treated to that effect. The next LEO will be on Wednesday, April 19th, at 6:00 P.M. at the Copal Progressive Mexican Cuisine at 4747 Pioneers.
