Incoming California and North Carolina Exchange A Uniquely Nebraska Experience

n Wednesday, May 28, 2014, Ambassadors from Los Angeles, California and Charlotte, North Carolina arrive in Lincoln for a six day home-stay. Many activities are planned for our visitors celebrating venues that are unique to Nebraska or are a part of its history. Come and join us for the activities.

After spending Wednesday evening getting acquainted with their hosts, the Ambassadors begin their activities on Thursday, May 29 with a tour of the Capitol. They will have lunch at the Governor's Mansion and tour either the Larsen Tractor Test Lab or the Quilt Museum at UNL. That evening the Welcome Dinner includes Cherrie Beam Clarke from the Nebraska Humanities Council presenting her program on "The Courage to Continue." Her program depicts Nebraska life on the prairie.

Friday, May 30, the Ambassadors travel to York to explore early farm life at Wessel's Living History Farms and have lunch at Chances R Restaurant. They travel on to Seward for a tour of the Seward Library and the Junto Winery.

Ambassadors will attend a Small Group Dinner either on the evening of Friday, May 30th, or Saturday, May 31. Saturday, the Ambassadors travel to Nebraska City. They will have an opportunity to see the Tractor Relay/ Parade participants. They will spend time at the Lied Lodge and participate in the Tree Adventure and Discovery Ride. Lunch will be at the Lied Lodge Restaurant. In the afternoon, they tour the Missouri River Basin Lewis and Clark Center and the Kregel Windmill Factory.

Sunday, June 1, offers a Free Day for the Ambassadors and their hosts. Monday, June 2, begins with brunch at the Spring Creek Prairie Audubon Center. Once back in Lincoln, they will tour the UNL Diary Store, complete with an ice cream treat. The Farewell Dinner will be held at Valentino's on S. 70th Street. The ambassadors will depart on Tuesday, June 3.

A Dessert and Coffee gathering for new and prospective members was held the evening of Sunday, April 13. Invitations had been extended to 38 new and prospective

members. Four new members and two prospective members attended the event, held at Forest Lake Estates Clubhouse. In addition, Carolyn Kitterer, a 2013 recipient of The Moore Memorial Scholarship, explained her home-hosting experiences on the recent 25day New Zealand Exchange. This scholarship is dedicated to Alice and Corwin Moore plus Jack and Jeane Moore. Also in attendance were President, Larry Kluck; Membership Committee, Gayle Bayer, Amy Birky, and Mary Bryant; plus Milt Bayer.

Here is a bit of scholarship history. Alice Moore is recognized as the founder of FFL. She was appointed by the Mayor of Lincoln to establish a Friendship Force club in the community and was exchange director for the first exchange of 250 ambassadors to Newcastle-upon-Tyne, England in 1980. Alice's husband, Corwin served as Club Treasurer and Historian for a number of years.

In May 1985 Friendship Force International staged an event to publicize their program. FFI created an International Awareness Award for media that do exceptionally meritorious work to educate its constituency about people and their problems in other countries. FFI then hosted a special dinner in Omaha and presented the award to The Omaha World Herald for the paper's eight-part series called "The Population Bomb." Proceeds from the dinner totaled \$4,000 and were split between the Friendship Force of Greater Omaha and the Friendship Force of Lincoln.

Thus, FFL created a General Scholarship Fund, and set up an objective to establish an Endowment Fund of \$10,000. The Endowment Fund is supported by specified donations and other designated fund raising projects, and its income supports the scholarship program.

Memorials at the times of Jack and Jeane Moore's deaths (1994 and 2007 respectively) established another award: the Jack and Jeane Moore Scholarship. Jack and Jeane Moore took part in the Lincoln/Newcastle Friendship Force Exchange in 1980 when they hosted four giggly teenage girls; it began a lifetime friendship and participation in many other in-bound and out-bound exchanges. Jack and Jeane believed in the FF mission and wanted to help young people experience the value of international relationships. Jack and Jeane Moore were not related to Alice and Corwin Moore.

In August 2009 the General Scholarship Fund and the Jack and Jeane Moore Scholarship were combined into one. It was named: The Moore Memorial Scholarship dedicated to Alice and Corwin Moore, and Jack and Jeane Moore.
