n Sunday, April 21st, we set sail on the Holland American Line (HAL) ship, Zeiderdam, leaving from Ft. Lauderdale, FL to participate in the FFI sponsored cruise across the Atlantic with the destination to Copenhagen, Denmark. My roommate for the adventure was Marilyn Peterson from the Oregon's Mid-Willamette Valley Club. She and I have remained friends since 2005 when our clubs enjoyed reciprocal domestic journeys.

We participated in HAL activities, their scheduled excursions at the ports of call as well as many FF activities and workshops planned for the 18 days we were at

sea. The FF sessions lasted approximately 1 hour when we had full days at sea. We were free the rest of the day for the activities of our own choosing. Our FF members also met most days at sea for a Happy Hour, scheduled by FFI Board Member, Jo Custead of the Saskatoon Club. These Happy Hours gave members a chance to meet members of clubs throughout the world and helped make a smaller group onboard.

In 2017 they offered the first "Festival at Sea", which drew about 60+ members. This was the 2nd journey at sea and there is a 3rd one planned for 2019. For this cruise, there were participants from Australia (6), New

Zealand (12), Japan (2), Canada (15), and approximately 58 from the clubs throughout the US, including two FFI staff members, Jeremi Snook and Laura Romero. Beside myself, there were two members of The FF of Greater Omaha. In addition, two other individuals from Lincoln, Karen Kuhn and Sally O'Neill, were on the cruise. Susan Copenhaver and her mother Theresa Copenhaver. Jeremi and Laura introduced the opening sessions providing us with several fun activities for us to meet other member participants on board. On several days, we were introduced to various activities which FFI is adding to their programs. A Preview of the 2019 Conference in Boulder, CO

uring the Festival at Sea, we were introduced to the plans for the 2019 International Conference. It will be held in Boulder, Colorado with all of Colorado's 4 clubs assisting with the planning. Be sure to save the date for July 23-27, 2019. Due to hurricane, Marian, the conference planned in Porto Rico was cancelled and this conference was rescheduled in Colorado.

They will be retooling future conferences with some ideas implemented this year. The first part of the conference will be devoted to content workshops, preparing clubs for the future and succession planning for each club. There will be content about the history of FF. The second part will be a cultural focus on the Colorado area. FFI will add speakers

with subject matter content in citizen diplomacy. Many members have indicated that past conference prices have been expensive limiting who can attend. Thus FFI will be collaborating with the University of Colorado at Boulder for conference space, on-campus housing, and arrangements, making this a more affordable stay. Each club is going to receive a personal invitation to send a representative to the conference to bring back these ideas to share with your club. FFI is going to begin working with the Peace and **Conflict Studies at Boulder** workshops and translation services for members who do not speak English. Our newer members no longer understand or realize processes of the formation of FFI in the early years. This is an easy location for FF Lincoln. Save the date for this one too. It should prove to be an informative and innovative conference.

The French Toast with warmed seasonal fruit looked good as did the Fried Farm Egg Sandwich. From the lunch menu, the Squash Banh Mi with grilled squash, carrot and daikon pickle on baquette was an interesting choice. Later Chef Jake Thiessen spoke to the group and told us more about the Hub Café. The Hub Café started in 2016, is owned by Branch Oak Farm and provides farm to fork foods. Much of the produce used to prepare the menu items is from Lone Tree Foods, a collective company of local farm producers.

The next LEO is October 16th at Shogun Japanese Restaurant 3700 South 9th Street Lincoln, Nebraska.




