few places are still available for Lincoln Friendship Force's upcoming journey to Georgia and Azerbaijan. Home stays in Tblisi and Baku are included.

A highlight In Georgia will be a visit to the 6th Century Jvari Monestery and 11th Century Svetitskhoveli Cathedral where the Robe of Christ is buried. Both are UNISCO World Heritage Sites.

The Uplistsike Cave Town where a theatre, temple and ancient market have been carved into the soft sandstone and the Stalin Museum and house where Joseph Stalin was born are both scheduled.

In Azerbaijan the group will enjoy a boat tour on the Caspian Sea, a baking demonstration of Tendir Chorek, Azerbaijan's National bread, and a chance to see a ballet or opera. Members will have an opportunity to reconnect with Friendship Force members who came to Lincoln last year.

The dates of the journey are Oct 2-15. The cost of the journey is \$2,145 including transporation, fees, entrance tickets, parties, and 2 nights in Sheki. A partial scholarship based on financial need is possible. For additional information, contact Wendy Horacek, 402-327-9656, whoracek@yahoo.com.

affodil Mediterranean Cuisine was our last LEO outing on July 25th. It was an excellent turnout of 27 club members and 1 guest (The Friendship Force Sarasota). What a treat it was to be able to sample some of the foods before we ordered. Narges Montazer is the owner and prepares all of her own foods. Narges came to the USA about 26 years ago while her husband was a student at the University. She is a native of Iran and told me that the word Daffodil is the Persian translation of her name Narges.

Narges started making food for friends and many urged her to start selling her different dishes. The Lincoln farmers market was her starting point for this with baklava and several other dishes. She is now in her second sit down location next to Eileen's cookies in the Old Cheney Center. There you will find the menu on a black chalk board full of exciting dishes all with numbers and prices. The menu include items like Pomegranate Walnut Chicken, Meatballs with berry's or a dish she makes every day Eggplant Parmesan. If you have never eaten here before I would highly recommend that you stop by and try the Daffodil.

n May 21st a rainy Tuesday night 18 members of the Lincoln Friendship force gathered at Vung Tau Pho Grill Restaurant. The Vietnamese restaurant has been in business for 20 plus years. Daniel explained how the building had been expanded over the years and will now seat about 75 people. He explained the menu which included 43 options. Appetizers included Spring rolls (2) that were very tasty and almost a meal by themselves. You could also choose Egg rolls or fried shrimp. The steaming Pho (beef and rice noodle soup) came in 3 sizes and 12 different combinations of beef. Some had Com Dia which is a steaming rice platter with grilled pork or chicken and fresh veggies. Daniel had a special for that night of Spare Ribs. A large helping de-boned BBQ rib meat over rice. The serving sizes were large and many left with to go boxes in hand. The Bubble Tea was an interesting cold drink that came in multiple flavors. Carlene had a Peach Bubble tea which was very refreshing and contained large pieces of peach fruit in the drink.
