The Annual Meeting of FFL was held on August 25, 2019 at Southeast Community College. A reception was held at 4:30 p.m. with an international dinner catered by the culinary arts students and instructors at Southeast Community College. The business meeting followed the dinner.

- *The 2018 Slate of Officers was presented by the Nominating Committee and moved by acclamation to elect Arlene Rea as President, Maxine Moul as Vice President, Milt Bayer as Treasurer and Ann Quinlan as Secretary.
- A PowerPoint report of the July Friendship Force International Conference in Boulder, CO was presented by Arlene Rea, Wendy Horacek and Julie Albrecht. JoEllen Polzien, Laurie Ann and Larry Scott also attended the conference. During the evening, JoEllen shared her pictures from the Austin, Texas journey.
- Members were asked to indicate their interest in participating in a strategic planning session or open world activity.

FFI World Conference in Boulder, CO: Six members, Julie Albrecht, Wendy Horacek, JoEllen Polzein, Laurie Ann and Larry Scott and Arlene Rea, attended the three-day conference. The keynote speaker focused on World Peace and how Friendship Force is and can be a force for change. Over three hundred delegates from around the world attended.

By-Laws Committee: No action as they were reviewed and adopted in 2017.

Passports: Four issues were available to members in March, May, August and November.

Policy and Procedures Committee: No action as they were reviewed and adopted in 2018.

Strategic Planning: A Strategic Planning Session was held October 20, 2019, from 1 to 5 p.m. at Madonna Hospital, Sheridan Room with 22 members participating. A new mission statement was developed: Open-minded people with a world perspective, who promote global understanding with world citizens, to address friendship and peace. Members divided into four groups and brainstormed ideas to better facilitate four strategic pillars: Membership, Marketing, Leadership, Member Participation. As a result, new/redesigned committees, with more member involvement, were formed: Membership Recruitment, Mentoring, Marketing (combining website/social media/publicity) and Social. Committees met with their members to set goals and implement plans for 2020.

Following the October FFL Strategic Planning meeting, **Janet Walters**, **Nancy Comer**, **Cheryl Johnson and Phyllis Arth** met to explore expanding FFL meal sharing (known previously as small group dinners and diversity dinners) to build understanding and promote friendship within our organization and within the Lincoln Community. Janet will present this to the board at the January 2020 board meeting.
