
## Friendship Force of Lincoln 2024 Assigned Journeys

fter Covid and various delays, FFI has assigned FFL an exciting outbound journey. Check your maps and the internet, we are going to JAVA, Indonesia in March 2024.

We will fly into Jakarta in northern Java, then proceed to BOGOR. Bogor is considered a bedroom community of Jakarta. It is about one hour from Jakarta and much cooler. It is known for its extensive botanical gardens, zoological museum, and agricultural school. It is known for fresh fruits, sour vegetable salads, and, surprisingly, apple pies and baked macaroni.





The second homestay will be YOGYAKARTA. It is in central Java and is considered the arts and culture center. Expect to find batik textiles, wayang puppetry, and silver goods. Yogyakarta is near the Bobobudur and Prambanan archeological centers.

Java is mostly a Muslim country; however, it is a safe and welcoming country. Other than Bali on the southern tip, the country is very affordable.

## Open World/COIL Program on Hold

embers of Friendship Force of Lincoln have been preparing for a visit from Pre-school and Kindergarten Principals from Romania, July 28 – August 5, 2023, and we recently learned that this visit is now on hold.

I received an email from Taryn Roberts, the newest member of Friendship Force International team working very closely with Dana Jackson on Open World Programming, on April 17, 2023.

"We received a very unexpected announcement from COIL that they are putting all programming from July 1 to October 1 on hold. This has never happened in the history of the program and Dana and I were very very surprised. We immediately requested a meeting with COIL officers so we could get some more information. We were told that a variety of factors happened to coincide that drastically impacted their cash flow (inflation, transportation rental cost increases, and doubling of the cost of refundable plane tickets). They are temporarily suspending programming during Q3 as a stopgap measure.

Unfortunately, COIL does not have all the details in regards to what this means for FFI and for the local host communities. They are unsure if the programs will be rescheduled. They also mentioned that they may be able to start programming back on September 1. I wish that we had more information to share with you at the time. We will continue to update you as we are able. If you have any questions do not hesitate to reach out to me or Dana by email or phone. We might not have the answers but we will do our best to help navigate this tricky and unprecedented situation."

FFL is disappointed by the delay and we will await more information regarding the Romanian educators' visit to Lincoln.




## Ten Ways to Participate in FFL Without Leaving Your Town

- 2. **Don't have a guest room?** Host a small group dinner, be a day host for a working host, or just attend the club welcome and farewell dinners for incoming Journey participants.
- 3. **Open up your world.** Serve on a committee to plan the week's activities for the incoming ambassadors; or help with an Open World visit of Russian delegates who want to learn about democracy and how it works.



- 4. **Travel by proxy.** Attend the All-Member Meeting featuring a recent Outbound or Domestic Journey. See their slides, taste the food from that country, and hear about our members International experiences.
- 5. **Get out of the house.** Attend diversity events held in Lincoln to meet people and learn about other cultures; for example, a picnic with the local Sudanese community.
- 6. Build local friendships. Serve on a committee working to build friendships among people of other ethnicities, cultures and religions in our community.
- 7. **Be an FF leader or a coordinator.** Work on a Committee that could result in you as a Journey Coordinator for an incoming group; or help coordinate local activities with other organizations such as OLLI or diversity groups.



- 8. **Learn more about Lincoln.** Represent Friendship Force visibly at city events that have similar goals. Maybe volunteer to help with World Day on the Mall or attend a Mosque to learn about Ramadan.
