resident Jimmy Carter announced the formation of The Friendship Force on March 1, 1977 at a White House conference with state governors. President Wayne Smith and Executive Director Wade Seal then worked with a small staff in Atlanta to arrange the "maiden exchange" and to create support for The Friendship Force worldwide. The first exchange (now called journey) was to Newcastle upon Tyne, England.

In 2022, I coordinated two incoming ALEX (American Leadership Experience) groups from Slovakia and Hungary and another from Kyrgyzstan.

My favorite thing about Friendship Force was the opportunity to work with the young people through ALEX. In addition, I am always amazed at the number of FFL members who are willing to help with any of the tasks and experiences.

2. In 2020 and 2021, I was honored to be asked to be President of Friendship Force of Lincoln. Unfortunately, or maybe even fortunately, COVID closed all in- person activities during the

two years. As a club, we learned to be resourceful. We learned we could continue to meet by Zoom, so we didn't lose touch with each other. We conducted board meetings, an annual meeting, travel log journeys, afternoon clubs and one-on-one meetings all by Zoom. We did not travel, nor did we host ambassadors in our homes. By September of 2021, we held our annual meeting outdoors. It was the first time many of us had seen each other since March of 2020.

Again in 2024, I have been asked to lead FFL. This will be a new experience without COVID. Judy Keetle has done an outstanding job leading FFL in 2022 and 2023. I hope to emulate her work.

3. In my spare time, I take classes in watercolor and paint, travel to visit our two sons and their families, read, garden and play mahjong. I am also an officer (treasurer) in the Nebraska State Education Association-Retired.

2. I accepted the nomination as Vice-President as I was quite honored that another member thought I possessed the capabilities to carry out the duties of VP and future duties that may


