
## From the FFL President February 2024

## Bogor and Yogyakarta invite Friendship Force of Lincoln to Java

Please join the Friendship Force of Lincoln for an international Journey to two communities in Java, Indonesia in June 2024. Lincoln participants will stay in local homes and experience the cultures of their hosts.

The first community is Yogyakarta (English: / joogjəˈkɑːrtə/Jogjakarta), the capital city of the region in the south-central part of the island of Java. As the only Indonesian royal city still ruled by a monarchy, Yogyakarta is regarded as an important center for classical Javanese fine arts and culture such as ballet, batik textiles, drama, literature, music, poetry, silversmithing, visual arts, and wayang puppetry.

Yogyakarta will be visited June 1 to 7. The second community being visited June 8-14 is Bogor in the West Java province, Indonesia. Located around 60 kilometers (37 mi) south of the national capital of Jakarta, Bogor is the 6th largest city in the Jakarta metropolitan area and the 14th overall nationwide. The city has a presidential palace and a botanical garden (Indonesian: Kebun Raya Bogor) – one of the oldest and largest in the world. It bears the nickname "Rainy City" (Kota Hujan), because of frequent rain showers, even during the dry season.

We will be limited to 15 Ambassadors. Ambassadors may add pre and post visits to Bali, Japan or South Korea. Watch for future information from FFL's emails and Passports. 
